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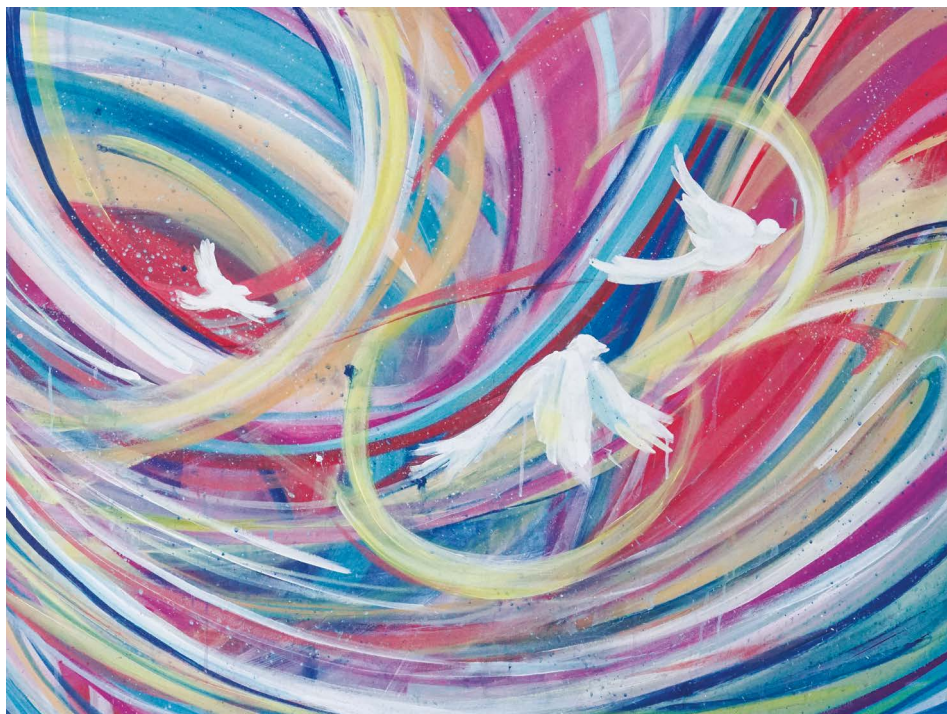

I am excited for you to hear from authors that may not get the opportunity to speak at your church, or who may sit in the pew at your church and feel unqualified, when in fact they are.

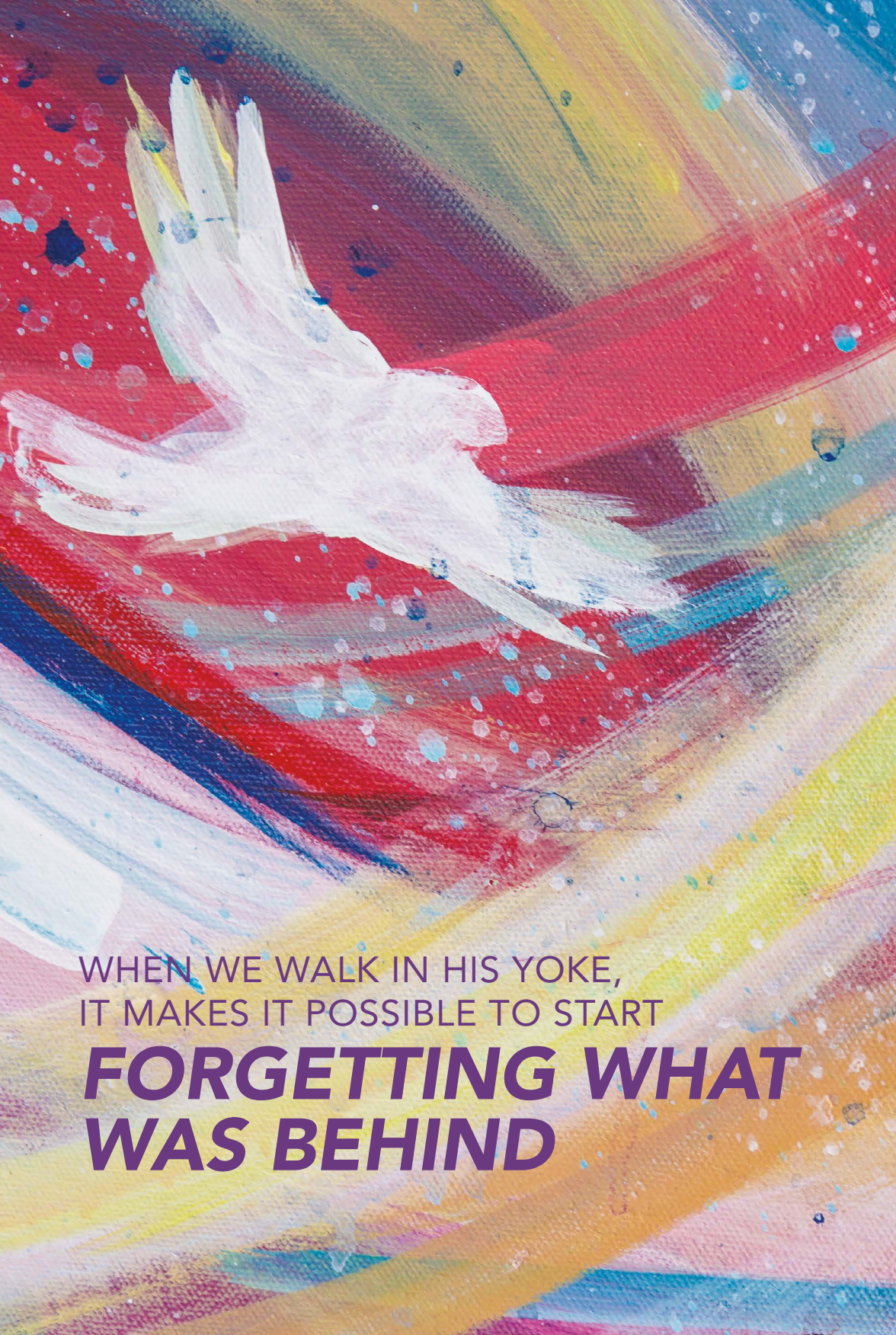

# DAY 1

Read Philippians 3:13-14  
*“Forgetting what is behind and  
straining toward what is ahead.”*

## REFLECTION

# DAY 3

# DAY 4

Read Isaiah 58:11

God promises to satisfy our needs fully and He does not placate us with, “good enough for now.” We will exhaust ourselves trying to prove we can meet our own needs. We will become furious with those who can't or won't attempt to meet them. Yet God says He will meet us and satisfy us. Where is your sun-scorched and barren place? Go there. Admit your thirst. Seek the One who loves you and promises to meet you there and satisfy your thirst.

## PRAYER

We look to you to show us our sun-scorched places where only you can satisfy. Only you will actually meet us there to bring us the living water. Deliver us from denial. Give us eyes to see and ears to hear and directions to follow you to that place where you can satisfy our true needs and not just alleviate symptoms. Amen.

# DAY 7

Read Colossians 3:12-14

*“Put on love, which binds them all together in perfect unity.”*

## REFLECTION

In this passage, Paul urges us to walk in the new identity God has given us. This new identity involves a conscious effort to display specific character attributes. First, Paul reminds us that our position before God is, in fact, an act of God. We are chosen and beloved by Him. The attributes that Paul goes on to list are derived from this fact. This means that so long as we align ourselves with this truth and “put on” the traits that Paul describes, then God’s character will not fail to shine through. Compassion means empathy for the struggles of others. Everything else in this passage builds from that idea up to God’s ultimate characteristic: Love. Paul calls love the perfect bond of unity. It is so perfect that it binds us fallen men and women with our perfect Creator. In the same way, we are to allow it to bind us together with our brethren.

## PRAYER

Lord, I have come so far, yet have so much further to go. Help me to develop strong, healthy boundaries but do not allow me to lose sight of the needs of the people you have placed around me. Develop within me the compassion that you have shown me. Allow me to model at least a portion of the kindness, humility, gentleness and patience that abounds in your character. You have forgiven me for wickedness I don’t think I could have forgiven others. Overwhelm me with your Spirit so that I can walk in that forgiveness and give it to others. Make it natural for me to love as you love. Let it become as normal for me as it is for you. You are my Lord and my Father. Amen.

# DAY 11

Read Galatians 2:20

*“I have been crucified with Christ  
and I no longer live.”*

## REFLECTION

When I was in prison, I became so angry at those who would tell me, “You just have to have faith.” There I was, being sentenced to 52 months without my wife, without my kids, and without my family. I got so mad at that phrase. Every time I heard it, I wanted to yell and scream and give the person saying it a piece of my mind. I wanted to tell them that you couldn’t have faith, because nothing good could come of this situation.

I am now eight months out and am a house manager for a Christ-centered transitional house for men who are just getting out of prison. I have shared my story at a church that is home to thousands of people, and I have friends around me who are closer than family. Faith can be a tricky thing because we want to see the results now. We crave answers just as we crave oxygen to breathe. But looking back, I had to be sentenced. I had to be broken. I had to go through every hurt, every tear, every pain, and every struggle. Because if I didn’t, I would have never found Christ and I most certainly would not have the faith that I do today—a faith so strong that I now know how David felt when he fought Goliath.

## PRAYER

God, I want to thank you for the pain that led me to you. I thank you for every struggle, every gashed lip, every bruise, every wound, because without that, I would have never been broken to the point where I needed you. I know that no matter what I face in the future, it is all to glorify you and your greater good. I pray that you remind me that the toxic shame of who I used to be no longer holds any bearing to who I am today. I am thankful of the unwavering, unmoving faith that I have today. Amen.

# DAY 12

Read 1 Peter 3:8-9

## REFLECTION

Peter is writing to persecuted Christians who were scattered all throughout Asia Minor. At first, he tells them what the conduct and attitude towards one another should be. Then he tells them what the attitude and conduct should be towards those who are persecuting them. Peter begins by saying, “Finally, all of you, be like-minded, be sympathetic, love one another, be compassionate and humble. Do not repay evil with evil or insult with insult.” He is telling them that, “Hey, you’re all in this together. You’re being persecuted because of your love for Christ.” Because everyone is going through this, they need to have compassion for each other, and love each other as Christian brothers and sisters. They must also be tender hearted and kind. These attitudes and actions apply to Christians today as well.

Then in verse 9, he says, “Do not repay evil with evil or insult with insult. On the contrary, repay evil with blessing, because to this you were called so that you may inherit a blessing.” When they make fun of you, when they call you names, when they blaspheme you—Christians are to give them a blessing.

Father God, I thank you for the strength you give me, to get through and to rejoice in the good and bad times. I thank you for your Word that is instruction to help guide me through everyday situations. I thank you that you equip me. I decree and declare today that I will only focus on the positive in every situation in Jesus name. Amen.


