

Holy Week recalls the events of our Lord's suffering and death. We recall his triumphant entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, his giving of the New Commandment on Maundy Thursday, his crucifixion and burial on Good Friday, and the solemn vigil of Saturday night before Easter Sunday.

Use this guide to walk through Holy Week with your loved ones or in solitary devotion. Reflect on the truth of Scripture and pray that the Lord would draw you closer to him during this season.



READ

Matthew 21:1-11

REFLECT

Our humble King is coming to us as we cry out, "Hosanna," which means, "Save us!"

PRAY

Thank God that he moved towards us in humility through his Son, Jesus Christ, to save us from Satan, sin, and death. Ask the Lord to help you submit to his loving rule.

MAUNDY THURSDAY*


The Last Supper

READ


Luke 22:7-23

REFLECT

Jesus, the true Passover lamb, will soon give his body and shed his blood as a sacrifice for our salvation.



^{*} Maundy Thursday is also called Holy Thursday. The word *maundy* comes from the Latin word *mandatum*, which means *commandment*. It refers to the new commandment that Jesus gave during his last supper with his disciples.



PRAY

Ask God to help you remember his loving sacrifice for you and thank him for planning your salvation.

Jesus Washes the Disciples' Feet

READ

John 13:1-20

REFLECT


In humility, servanthood, and love, Jesus washed his disciples' feet just as he would wash away their sins through his death.



PRAY

Praise God for his goodness and generosity. Ask him to help you humbly love those around you – even your enemies.


The Passion: Prayer in the Garden

READ

Matthew 26:36-46

REFLECT

Jesus turns to God the Father in his sorrow at what is to come, fully submitting to the Father's will.



PRAY

Praise God for his compassion and understanding of your struggles. Ask him to give you comfort in your sorrow and the obedience needed to follow him.

May I be willing, Lord, to bear Daily my cross for Thee; Even Thy cup of grief to share, Thou hast borne all for me.


Betrayal in the Garden

READ

Matthew 26:47-56

REFLECT

Judas the betrayer exchanged Jesus for a few coins, and Jesus willingly submitted to arrest knowing it would lead him to the cross.



PRAY

Ask God to forgive you for the times you exchange worship of him for worship of created things. Thank him for his willing and sacrificial death on your behalf.

GOOD FRIDAY


The Trial before Pilate

READ

John 18:28-19:16


REFLECT

Pilot declares Jesus innocent three times before handing him over to death.



PRAY

Praise God because he is our Deliverer who sent his innocent Son to be our substitute. Ask God to forgive you for your sins. Thank him for his sacrifice.



The Crucifixion

READ

Luke 23:32-43


REFLECT

Jesus Christ, fully human and fully God, was killed on a cross to pay the debt owed by you for your sins.

PRAY

Thank the Lord for his sacrificial death. Ask him to help you more deeply understand his love and sacrifice.

His dying crimson, like a robe, Spreads o'er His body on the tree; Then I am dead to all the globe, And all the globe is dead to me.


Were the whole realm of nature mine, That were a present far too small; Love so amazing, so divine, Demands my soul, my life, my all.

READ


Matthew 28:1-7


REFLECT

PRAY

Praise the Lord that Jesus Christ showed himself as our true King who conquered death when he left the grave. Ask God to help you tell others about this good news.

READ


John 20.11-18

REFLECT

Jesus drew near to Mary Magdalene in her grief at the grave, and she recognized him when he said her name.

PRAY

Thank God that we have a Great High Priest who sympathizes with us in our weakness. Ask him to help you recognize and respond when he calls your name.

He lives, all glory to His name! He lives, my Jesus, still the same. Oh, the sweet joy this sentence gives, "I know that my Redeemer lives!"


Jesus Appears to the Disciples
